SENATOR LEA WEBB LAUNCHES ONLINE SURVEY TO GATHER FEEDBACK FROM NYSEG CUSTOMERS IN THE SOUTHERN TIER

Binghamton, NY - Today, New York State Senator Lea Webb launched an online survey to gather feedback from community members living in Senate District 52 about their experiences with New York State Electric & Gas (NYSEG).
