Currently, he is working to enact legislation that would prevent violent felons from being released back into our local communities on parole.

“We cannot continue to put innocent New Yorkers at risk. As Chairman of the Crime Victims, Crime and Correction Committee, I will work to adopt a tougher stance on crime and issues relating to parole to keep our streets and communities safe for law-abiding New Yorkers,” said Senator Nozzolio.
