State Senator Patty Ritchie joined students from the Thousand Islands Central School District Thursday to cut the ribbon on the Village of Clayton's "Wooden Castle Playground."

Recently, the playground was rebuilt with help from community members and soldiers from the 10th Mountain Division's 7th Engineer Battalion. Last year, Senator Ritchie secured \$50,000 in special funding to help the village offset costs associated with construction.
