According to Parks & Trails of New York, the state's leading advocate for New York's parks and trails system, last year's event saw 6,500 volunteers take part in more than 200 projects at 95 state parks and historic sites across the state.

"To see hundreds of local volunteers coming together, taking time out of their busy schedules to make them a priority is an incredible experience.
