## SENATOR ALESI OPPOSES TAKEOVER OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION FUNDS BY SENATE DEMOCRATS

Rather than pass the 2010-2011 State Budget to open state parks and provide the necessary money needed for proper staffing and maintenance, Senate Democrats approved a last-minute, rough-shod proposal introduced by Governor Paterson that will deplete the state's Environmental Protection Fund and impose millions of dollars in new taxes and fees on businesses and residents. I vehemently opposed this legislation - masquerading as a parks-opening bill - which, in fact, will be a business-closing, job-killing bill. What our state cannot afford is the continuing tax-and-spend mentality that Governor Paterson and his fellow Democrats have espoused for nearly eighteen months. For the second straight week, the Governor and his colleagues have raided an outside source of dedicated funds - last week, more than \$65 million from the New York Power Authority was siphoned - due to their inability to negotiate a budget in public, in good faith, and for the benefit of all New Yorkers.
