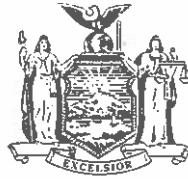

**Re: Indian Point Transformer Fire**

Dear Mr. Mohl,

We write to request information regarding this past weekend's incident that occurred at Entergy's Indian Point nuclear power plant as members of the New York State Senate, and serving as the Chair of the New York State Senate Standing Committee on Energy and Telecommunications, it is our duty to ensure that the people of New York are informed on all issues related thereto. This responsibility includes being able to accurately explain, among other things, accidents that occur at facilities lying within our state's borders.


The residents of the Hudson Valley, as well as those citizens living in other regions of the state where nuclear power plants are located, should be assured that their safety and well-being are not at risk due to incidents such as the one that occurred on Saturday. Nuclear power plants are great producers of efficient, clean energy, and, as you know, there are stringent federal and state safety protocols in place that We have no doubt Entergy has followed appropriately.

What we are asking of you is to help us put the minds of our constituents at ease, particularly those that we interact with in the Hudson Valley. We would like for you to provide us with a detailed description of what happened to the transformer at Indian Point that caused it to catch fire and to spill liquid. We understand that there is an internal investigation of the accident taking place and we would like to know, when the investigation is complete, whether or not the spill impacted the Hudson River. Additionally, it would be helpful to learn Entergy's plan of action on how to prevent a future incident of this kind.

Entergy has acted as a good partner with the Senate Energy and Telecommunications Committee in the past and your cooperation over the years is much appreciated. We plan to maintain this positive relationship and look forward to hearing from you in the near future.
