

New York State Dwyer Coalition Proposal

The Hudson Valley National Center for Veteran Reintegration (HVNCVR) has worked tirelessly to build a strong coalition with existing and emerging Pfc Joseph P Dwyer Programs throughout New York State to ensure the needs of Veterans returning home from military service get the continuum of care they deserve. While no two Veterans are the same, the coalition works to speak with one clear voice about the struggles Veterans face and how the Dwyer Programs assist them with successfully reintegrating into civilian society. With the expansion of the Dwyer Program to every county in New York State, there will be an even greater need to provide a single location for resources and a platform to support the work of each Dwyer Program on behalf of Veterans.

HVNCVR established the NYS State Dwyer Coalition in 2020, prior to becoming an official recipient of the Dwyer Program grant. Our passion for this program and desire to continue developing this coalition requires additional resources and dedicated attention. The expansion from 25 counties in size, with the expected growth to 62 counites will significantly impact the deliverables of quality of service. - Coordinate Monthly Meetings of Dwyer Program representatives (1.5 hr teleconference)
 - o Meetings will be attended by guest speakers
 - o Allow all Dwyer Programs to collaborate and share resources
 - o Guide and coordinate questions to correct representatives
