Mrs. Thomas was selected for her decades-long service to the Rochester community. She established the Freddie Thomas Foundation to honor the legacy of her late husband, civil rights activist Dr. Freddie Thomas. The Foundation provides a free space for community organizations and has funded countless projects in Rochester, including the Jane Pittman Drinking Fountain which provides free drinking water in the center of the city.

Today, Mrs. Thomas continues her work, inspiring the next generation of community leaders in Rochester.

As the founder of the Freddie Thomas Foundation formally known as the Triangle Building now located at the Harro East Building, she became one Rochester's First African-American to own a major commercial building. She continued the work of supporting community youth which was started by the late Dr. Freddie L. Thomas, her husband. That is is just one of the many accomplishments of Mrs. Thomas."

"Working with Midge over the past two-years has been a rewarding experience. Not only was I able to publish my first book, but I got to know a phenomenal woman who initiated positive change in the city of Rochester," said **Laura DiCaprio**, *author of Letters to Freddie: The Biography of Midge Thomas*.
