- PS 188Q in Bayside. Senator Liu joined Council Member Linda Lee and Queens Supreme Court Judge Karen Lin to swear in the Student Council.
- MS 216Q in Fresh Meadows. Senator Liu joined Public Advocate Jumaane Williams, Councilwoman Christine Liu, and Lieutenant Governor Antonio Delgado. During the school's Meet Your Civic Leaders Day, students learned about the election process, policy creation, local and state government.
