Rocco Vitullo and Gabe Alessandroni became the new owners in 1963, with
Gabriele Alessandroni becoming the sole owner 1973; his relatives,
Andrew and Debby Alesia, became the current owners in 1993; their son
Jared is a graduate of the Culinary Institute of America and a pastry
chef, while their son Martin is the shop's cake decorator; and

WHEREAS, For 95 years, the Florentine Pastry Shop has offered its loyal Utica area customers the finest quality foods and products, and the highest standards of service while remaining a gathering place for young and old alike and retaining the same old-time charm which has so characterized its past; and
