September 15-19, 2024, as Historically Black  
Colleges and Universities (HBCU) Week in the State

long-standing traditions, this Legislative Body is justly proud to  
memorialize Governor Kathy Hochul to proclaim September 15-19, 2024, as  
Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCU) Week in the State of  
New York, in conjunction with the observation of National HBCU Week; and

they were created to provide opportunities and access to education for

WHEREAS, HBCU graduates are exemplary public servants, scientists, doctors, artists, lawyers, judges, engineers, educators, entertainers, business owners, and leaders and have distinguished themselves in numerous ways; and

WHEREAS, For almost 200 years, HBCUs have been defined by unparalleled standards of learning and have produced countless leaders throughout the world; and

WHEREAS, With great admiration, this Legislative Body is proud to pay tribute to these colleges and universities which stand at the threshold of the future with their legacy of outstanding achievements and their impressive body of distinguished alumni; now, therefore, be it
