O'Mara and Palmesano pay tribute to Bath-Haverling girls soccer state champions

Bath, N.Y., June 10--State Senator Tom O'Mara (R,C-Big Flats) and Assemblyman Phil Palmesano (R,C-Corning) today visited Bath-Haverling High School to pay tribute to the Girls Varsity Soccer Team that won the New York State Public High School Athletic Association (NYSPHSAA) Class B championship last fall. O'Mara and Palmesano joined the athletes, coaches, and school administrators and staff for a ceremony to present an official Legislative Resolution they sponsored, which was approved by the state Senate and Assembly, honoring the team's victory in the Class B Girls Soccer championship on November 12, 2023 at Cortland High School.
