

Senator Lea Webb Delivers \$120,000 to Stewart Park for Upgrades to the Picnic Pavilion

Funding will support a new addition to the Picnic Pavillion to support the Ithaca Youth Bureau and the future establishment of the Wharton Studio & Cafe

ITHACA, NY – Today, Senator Lea Webb announced that she has allocated \$120,000 in state funding to support infrastructure upgrades at Stewart Park, one of Ithaca's most cherished community spaces. This funding will facilitate the construction of a new addition to the Picnic (Large) Pavilion in the park, providing vital enhancements for the Ithaca Youth

Bureau and paving the way for the future development of the Wharton Studio & Café.

The new addition to the Picnic (Large) Pavilion will house equipment and supplies for the Stewart Park Day Camp, which are currently stored in the Wharton Studio Building. This strategic relocation will consolidate the camp's operations into one building, significantly improving safety for campers and staff by eliminating the need to cross the parking lot to access camp gear and supplies. Additionally, the Pavilion's south façade will be visually enhanced, contributing to the park's aesthetic appeal.

"I am thrilled to have secured this funding for the City of Ithaca, which will make essential infrastructure upgrades to the Picnic Pavilion at Stewart Park," said Senator Lea Webb. "This park is a cornerstone of our community, offering a space where people of all ages can come together to enjoy recreation, education, and cultural activities. By enhancing the safety and accessibility of the Pavilion for the Ithaca Youth Bureau and its campers, we are not only supporting our youth but also laying the groundwork for the Wharton Studio Building to be transformed into a vibrant cultural center. I am committed to allocating resources to projects like this that strengthen our community bonds and create lasting opportunities for everyone to connect and thrive."
