My 41 years with the Endicott Sertoma Club and 14 years coaching the American Legion Post 82 baseball team have been central to my mission of making Endicott a better place to live, work, and raise a family. Now, as I enter my 26th year on the Union-Endicott Board of Education, that commitment remains as strong as ever.”
