Also featured at the event, Ritchie, a Newark High School student and STEADY Work employee. Through STEADY Work, Ritchie was recently empowered to purchase his first car, an accomplishment he shared would not have been possible without the help of the program and Lyons National Bank, which developed a program for Ritchie to finance the car and build his credit through monthly payments. Ritchie shared that, through his experience working in the Community Schools Newark Summer Program, he discovered his passion for working with children, something he now believes to be his purpose and calling.
