WHEREAS, Prior to becoming District Superintendent of Erie 1 BOCES, Donald A. Ogilvie served for eight years as Superintendent of the Hamburg Central School District; he has also served as Superintendent of both the Southwestern Central School District and the Chadwicks Union Free School District; and

WHEREAS, In addition, Donald A. Ogilvie was a building Principal in the Kenmore-Town of Tonawanda School District and began his illustrious career as a classroom teacher and team leader in the Williamsville Central School District; and

WHEREAS, Donald A. Ogilvie holds a Bachelor's and Master's degree in Education from Buffalo State College, and a Certificate of Advanced Study in Educational Administration from the University at Buffalo; and

WHEREAS, Active within his community, Donald A. Ogilvie is currently Vice-Chair of the Board of Trustees of the Buffalo Philanthropic Orchestra Society, a Trustee of WNY Public Broadcasting-WNED, a Trustee of Hilbert College and a Trustee of the Theodore Roosevelt Inaugural Site Foundation; and

WHEREAS, Furthermore, Donald A. Ogilvie is a member of the Vestry of St. Paul's Episcopal Cathedral, the Buffalo State College President's Community Advisory Board, the Rotary Club of Buffalo and Leadership Buffalo; and
