WHEREAS, In 1983, Jack J. Boak entered the school administration phase of his career when he began working for Jefferson-Lewis BOCES as assistant superintendent for programs and clerk of the board; and

WHEREAS, Jack J. Boak became deputy superintendent of Jefferson-Lewis BOCES in 2001, and was selected to lead the organization as district superintendent in 2003; and

WHEREAS, He served simultaneously for one year as interim superintendent of St. Lawrence-Lewis BOCES, as well as one year as superintendent of Oswego County BOCES; and

WHEREAS, In his multiple leadership roles, Jack J. Boak not only worked to improve learning opportunities for and make a difference in

the lives of students, he also served as a mentor to those who were just beginning their careers in the educational field; and

WHEREAS, Jack J. Boak is also dedicated to civic engagement; he has been an active member of the North Country community, serving on the boards of the Greater Watertown-North Country Chamber of Commerce, the Greater Seaway Council of the Boy Scouts of America, the Seaway Trail Foundation and the Jefferson County Historical Society; and
