WHEREAS, The Armory Foundation has collaborated with elected officials to stage the annual "Uptown Games" event, a track and field training exercise for students of upper Manhattan, an area suffering from an above average childhood obesity rate, to teach the fun and importance of exercise and health living, in conjunction with schools in the community; and provide ongoing free access for public schools to their state-of-the-art facility for long-term and continued benefit; and

WHEREAS, The Armory Foundation, and Norbert Sander, Jr., who is the only New Yorker to win the famed New York City Marathon, have touched the lives of so many New Yorkers and young athletes across America, and allowed them to achieve their dreams; and

WHEREAS, It is the sense of this Legislative Body that when an organization of such noble aims and accomplishments are brought to our attention it is appropriate to publicly proclaim and commend those individuals for the edification and emulation of others; now, therefore, be it RESOLVED, That this Legislative Body pause in its deliberations to commend the Armory Foundation for its many years of exemplary service to the community, the State of New York, and the United States; and be it further
