WHEREAS, As Director, Robert E. Hausrath served with loyalty, honor, and distinction, and was responsible for the planning and implementation of program policies and procedures, as well as for the educational quality and fiscal health of the organization; and

WHEREAS, This esteemed man has been called upon to contribute his time and talents to countless civic and charitable endeavors and has always given of himself unstintingly; and

WHEREAS, Robert E. Hausrath is the founder of the New York Inmate
Higher Educational Opportunity Program professional organization, where
he was elected to two terms on its executive committee; and
WHEREAS, In addition, Robert E. Hausrath designed and facilitated
workshops for students at Niagara University, and was a facilitator for
Peaceprints, an organization which assists inmates in their efforts to
transform their lives and make successful transitions to life in their
communities; and

WHEREAS, The recipient of numerous awards and accolades, Robert E. Hausrath was recognized with the 1995 President's Medal from Niagara University, the school's highest award, for his outstanding work with the Consortium and its students; and

WHEREAS, With him throughout have been his wife of 46 years, and their son, both of whom feel privileged to be a part of his life and rejoice in his achievements; and

WHEREAS, In his official acts, Director Robert E. Hausrath was governed by a keen sense of duty and always showed a unique grasp of human problems, earning him the admiration, esteem and affection of his colleagues; now, therefore, be it
