L. 97-28 which authorized and requested the President to proclaim the week beginning March 7, 1982 as Women's History Week; five years later, Congress passed Pub. L. 100-9 which designated the month of March of 1987, as Women's History Month;

WHEREAS, Between 1988-1994, Congress passed additional resolutions requesting and authorizing the President to proclaim March of each year as Women's History Month; since 1995, Presidents Clinton, Bush and Obama have issued a series of annual proclamations designating the month of March as Women's History Month; and

WHEREAS, It is the sense of this Legislative Body that when individuals and organizations of such noble aims and accomplishments are brought to our attention, they should be celebrated and recognized by all the citizens of this great Empire State; now, therefore, be it RESOLVED, That this Legislative Body pause in its deliberations to commemorate the 23rd Anniversary of the Annual Women Celebrating Women Gala, and paying tribute to this year's honorees; and be it further RESOLVED, That copies of this Resolution, suitably engrossed, be transmitted to the aforementioned honorees.
