WHEREAS, During his five decades of distinguished service, this esteemed firefighter served as Chief of Department, and President of the Floral Park Centre Fire Company Board of Commissioners, as well as Chairman of the 1st Battalion Chiefs Association and Chairman of the Nassau County Fire Commission; and

WHEREAS, George Groh is survived by his wife, Dotty, and his two daughters; and

WHEREAS, Volunteer firefighters and fire departments not only provide the critical service of fire protection but also engage in other activities of great benefit and importance to the communities they serve; and

WHEREAS, Citizens across our State and Nation are inspired by and indebted to our valiant firefighters who exhibit courage and bravery every day in the course of their duties; and

WHEREAS, It takes a special dedication, a strong desire to help others and a tireless sense of community to forsake precious time with family and friends to respond to the signal that a neighbor is in need; George Groh was such a firefighter; throughout his 50 years of devoted service, this volunteer heroically performed, above and beyond the call of duty, those responsibilities which define the task of fire protection; now, therefore, be it
