WHEREAS, During this time, with a deep and abiding faith in God, Molly Bango spent each and every morning at the Church of the Assumption praying for her loved ones; and

WHEREAS, This distinguished woman has experienced the incredible joys

and sorrows characteristic of and reserved for those with the stamina and courage to savor a full life; and

WHEREAS, Upon the completion of World War II, Molly Bango returned to Korell Dress Company, and soon after, she and her loving husband started a family; their daughter, Amor, was born in February of 1950, followed by their son, Joseph Michael, in September of 1952; and WHEREAS, A tradition Molly Bango continues to hold dear to her heart is weekly Sunday dinner after church; she has become legendary for her

homemade cavatelli, and continues to cook her favorite Italian specialties each week, welcoming her family which today includes five granddaughters and one grandson; and
