

State Senate Democratic Leader Malcolm A Smith, Democrats Poised To Take Back White House

(DENVER, CO)— A united party is the message Senate Democratic Leader Malcolm A. Smith (D – St. Albans) plans to bring home from the Democratic National Convention in Denver that kicked-off today.
