

## Senator Larkin Announces Grants For Several Local Charitable Organizations

Habitat for Humanity in the City of Newburgh has received \$50,000 toward the purchase of building materials and services for a new fully handicapped equipped home at 81 Carson Avenue in Newburgh. The home has been dedicated to a single mother with five children, one of whom is disabled and confined to a wheelchair.

Good Samaritan Food & Clothing Pantry in Walden has received \$5,000 toward its operating expenses, food, school supplies and equipment. Run strictly by volunteers, the Good Samaritan Food & Clothing Pantry currently serves approximately 80 needy families in Walden.

Jewish Family Service of Orange County, Inc. has received \$12,000 to help run its Friendly Visitor Program which matches volunteer visitors with homebound seniors and provides
