Senator Suzi Oppenheimer (D-Mamaroneck) today urged all women to give themselves a precious gift this Mother's Day – the gift of peace of mind. Stressing the importance of mammography and early detection in the fight against breast cancer, Senator Oppenheimer made her remarks in connection with the Adelphi NY Statewide Breast Cancer Hotline and Support Program's annual Mother's Day Mammography Campaign.

But the truth is that the vast majority of women do not have breast cancer and have nothing to fear." Even when a malignancy is found, early detection offers the most complete range of treatment options and the best prospect of a full recovery.
