

## Senator Johnson Gives \$50,000 Boost To Brentwood Library's Career Center

State Senator Owen H. Johnson (4th Senate District, Babylon), Chairman of the Finance Committee, recently paid a visit to the Brentwood Public Library where he had the opportunity to visit the library's Career and Educational Resource Center, for which he recently secured a \$50,000 state grant.
