Troy, November 20, 2009– Senator Roy McDonald was in Troy on Friday, where he met with two local civic organizations and visited a local business, he then traveled to Mechanicville to honor a local small business.

McDonald started the day at The Arts Center of the Capital District in Troy where he met with President Amy Williams and the organizations Board of Directors to discuss the goals and direction of the Arts Center.

More than 60 students from School 2 in Troy at the Arts Center where at the center learning about the classes, such as pottery and dance, that are available to them.

Recognizing the importance of locally owned businesses, McDonald visited Troy Downtown Collaborative Director Elizabeth Young at her store the "Living Room." The two discussed improvements to the downtown area to attract businesses and shoppers.
