Brooklyn - State Senator Martin J. Golden (R-C-I, Brooklyn) today issued the following statement in response to reports that two senior centers in his district, the Fort Hamilton-Saint John's Satellite and the Moose Lodge Senior Center will continue to operate beyond June 30th.

"This is a great day for all senior citizens of my district who have asked me to do everything in my power to keep their senior center open. Senior centers are homes away from home for many. These centers provide access to a nutritional meal, provide friendship, and help our older adults maintain a strong quality of life. I am glad that working with the Mayor, an agreement was reached to keep these two satellite senior centers open in our community."

The older adults of this community, those who made it what it is today, deserve to have the very best of opportunities.
