"The courage my beautiful Sarah displayed throughout her illness and at her death is the strength that keeps us going," said Matt Weippert.

The blood drive is held each year in honor of Sarah's birthday, which is March 31. Many people need blood during chemotherapy treatments and the blood drive is a way for Sarah to continue to have a positive effect on others.

"When I read about Sarah and the efforts of her parents, I was deeply touched. As a father, I can only imagine the heartache they have gone through. But thanks to the Weippert family, Sarah will continue to touch others. I applaud their efforts and hope that they get a large turnout," said Senator Martins.
