Under Ms. Shelby's leadership, the Visiting Nurses Association has solidified their position as one of Central New York's most trusted, respected and widely known home care systems.

Ms. Shelby serves on the Board of Directors at Community General Hospital, Francis House, and the Home Care Association of New York State. She is a member of the Governor-appointed Home Health Care Reimbursement Workgroup, charged with studying the impact of changes to the home care reimbursement system.

Senator DeFrancisco and his Senate Majority colleagues started the "Women of Distinction" program in 1998 as a way to recognize the contributions of women in New York State who have enhanced the lives of those around them and who, through their achievements, have inspired other women and their communities.
