

Senator Nozzolio Applauds Confirmation of Howard Milstein as Thruway Authority Chairman

New York State Senator Mike Nozzolio strongly supported and applauded the confirmation of Howard Milstein as the Chairman of the New York State Thruway Authority earlier this week. He is also a member of the Cornell University Board of Trustees.

During the Senate confirmation hearings, Mr. Milstein was unanimously supported and acclaimed by Legislators from both parties.
