Disappointed in Lack of Focus on Public Safety and Ridding System of Fraud and Abuse

Albany – State Senator Martin J. Golden (R-C-I, Brooklyn) has issued the following statement in response to Governor Andrew Cuomo's 2012 State of State address delivered this afternoon in Empire State Plaza Convention Center:

"Governor Andrew Cuomo spoke of some of the success of the last legislative session while creating a bold vision for the New York of the future. I look forward to working with the Governor and my colleagues in the New York State Legislature to create jobs, pass an ontime budget that closes our deficit without raising taxes, attract business to our State, improve our public education system, and reduce state spending and state bureaucracy.

New Yorkers want to get back to work, New Yorkers want a more efficient government that works for them, and the residents want to afford to call the Empire State home. Our citizens want to revel in the fact that they live and love New York. However, as a former New York City Police Officer, I am disappointed by the Governor's failure to focus on an agenda to keep New York's citizens and families safe. We can't ignore the fact that there are areas of criminal justice that must be addressed.
