Senator Charles J. Fuschillo, Jr. (R-Merrick) and Assemblyman David McDonough (R-North Merrick) recently joined with Mepham High School and Cablevision in encouraging

students to take an active stand against cyber-bullying.

The "Delete Cyberbullying" event, part of Cablevision's Power to Learn education initiative, featured Mepham High School upperclassmen making presentations to freshmen students about the impact cyberbullying has on its victims. Through an audience survey, video, power point presentation, and a storytelling skit, students talked about the damage that cyberbullying can cause, steps they can take to stop cyber-bullying, and the importance of looking out for one another and not being a bystander if they see cyber-bullying occurring.
