

Senator Martin J. Golden Announces Award to GEC

On, Monday, April 16th, Senator Martin J. Golden (R.C. I Brooklyn), will present a grant award of \$250,000 from the New York State Economic Development Assistance Program to The

Guild for Exceptional Children (GEC). The award was approved by the New York State
Senate Finance Committee and administered by the Dormitory Authority of the State of
New York.

The official award presentation will take place on Monday, April 16, 2012 from 1-1:30 p.m. at GEC's main headquarters located 260 – 68th Street, Brooklyn, NY.

Senator Golden stated, "I am proud to have awarded this funding to The Guild for Exceptional Children so to increase their operations and serve more of our most needy, Since 1958, the Guild

for Exceptional Children has been an integral part of our community and their work must continue."
