## Funding to Help Meet Growing Need at Victims Assistance Center

State Senator Patty Ritchie announced today that \$30,000 in state funding will be provided to the Victims Assistance Center of Jefferson County, to help protect victims of domestic violence.

The Victims Assistance Center of Jefferson County plays a vital role in the North Country, protecting and helping these victims. I'm pleased to be able to help the center continue to grow, so it can lead more people towards lives that are free of violence" said Senator Ritchie.

The Victims Assistance Center has been a part of the North Country community since 1979. Its mission is to assist and provide services to victims and survivors of violence and crime in Jefferson County. During the past 14 years, the Victims Assistance Center has increased both its staff and programs, to help

serve more people in need of help in Jefferson County.

This funding will allow the center to further expand, and will be utilized for prevention and direct services to victims of domestic violence, sexual assault and other crimes.
