The second seminar will take place on Thursday, June 7, from 6:30 PM – 8:30 PM, at the Roy C. Ketcham High School Auditorium, 99 Meyers Corners Road in Wappingers Falls.

Featured speakers for both seminars include Senator Steve Saland; Donna Bolner, Dutchess County Legislator and Tick Task Force Chair; Dr. Richard Ostfeld, Disease Ecologist from the Cary Institute of Ecosystem Studies in Millbrook; Andrew Rotans, MPH, Sr. Health Advisor and Christen Hertzog, Public Health Advisor from the Dutchess County Department of Health; and Jill Auerbach, Hudson Valley Lyme Disease Association Chair.

Attendees will hear from a panel of local experts on Dutchess County's growing Lyme disease problem, hear why 2012 is expected to be the worst year ever for Lyme and other tick-borne diseases, and learn ways to help protect yourself and your family. A question and
