Senator Fuschillo Supports Those Walking to Find a Cure for Lymphoma at 2012 Greater New York Lymphomathon

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Senator Charles J. Fuschillo, Jr. (R-Merrick) recently participated in the 2012 Greater New York Lymphomathon, where hundreds walked to raise critical funds for lymphoma research and education. Lymphoma is a type of blood cancer that occurs when white blood cells that help protect the body from infection and disease begin behaving abnormally.

Sponsored by the Lymphoma Research Foundation, the Lymphomathon is a non-competitive 5K walk where survivors, family, friends, community and corporate teams walk in honor and in memory of those whose lives have been touched by lymphoma. Hundreds of walkers participated in the event.

Senator Fuschillo thanked the walkers for their efforts in raising over \$175,000 for lymphoma research and services for individuals with lymphoma and their families.
