ALBANY, NY – Senator Klein (D-Bronx/Westchester) honored Sofie Somoroff, a seventeen year old from the Bronx at the 16th Annual Women of Distinction celebration that took place on the evening of Tuesday, May 7, 2013. Late last year, Somoroff was named the Grand Prize Winner of the OnBuzz Reach for the Stars Aspiring Filmmakers Contest for her lyrical, 71-second "micro-movie," entitled "Me," that concerns the subject of bullying. Sofie Somoroff said: "It is an honor to be nominated as a Woman of Distinction this year and I am thankful to Senator Klein for giving me the opportunity to celebrate in Albany with inspiring women from across New York. Making "Me," taught me a lot, not just about how to make a film, but also about the issue of cyberbullying. The more people who saw the movie, the more I learned that cyberbullying was something a lot of kids had experienced.
