Tuesday from 2pm – 7pm.

On Sunday, June 23rd, from 12pm to 4pm, Senator Golden and the Mayor's Housing Recovery Office are hosting a Forum at PS 277 located at 2529 Gerritsen Avenue. Multiple agencies will be answering questions on Sandy grants and issues.

Helping my constituents is the most important part of my job as State Senator, and to be able to provide those most in need following the storm is not only my responsibility, but the right thing to do," said Senator Golden.
