The event was held at Our Lady of Consolation located at 111 Beach Drive in West Islip on July 18, 2013 from 1 to 3 pm. NYS Department of State Division of Consumer Protection representative James Dees delivered a presentation to over 85 residents on ways to avoid becoming a victim of a scam. The Suffolk County Office for the Aging distributed information at the event as well.

Commission, complaints of "impostor scams" have been growing for several years and were
the sixth most frequent FTC complaint in 2010.
