## Senate Celebrates a Successful 2013 Unidat Latina Conference

*College Scholarships Awarded to Young Leaders,  
Informative Workshops Among the Highlights of the Two-Day Event*

The New York State Senate today celebrated the conclusion of the third annual Unidat Latina conference, which brought hundreds of community, business, and elected leaders together to help increase economic opportunities for the growing Hispanic community in New York State. The conference was held on September 27th and 28th, 2013, in Manhattan.

“I would like to thank the Hispanic Federation and the hundreds of participants and partners who helped make this year’s Unidat Latina a tremendously successful event,” Senate Majority Co-Leader Dean G. Skelos said. “The input we received will help set the agenda for next year’s Legislative session. We will fight to do everything we can to help Hispanic businesses grow and prosper, provide children with a quality education, and strengthen families.”

The conference included policy workshops, networking opportunities, and presentations featuring prominent speakers from the private and public sectors. Saturday’s Líderes Luncheon included an awards presentation for the second annual Unidat Latina scholarships to college-bound high school seniors. Each of the students was nominated by Senators and Assembly Members to receive \$2,000 for college. The awardees were chosen by an independent committee upon demonstrating academic achievement and community service.
