Carnegie Art Center to benefit from state grant assistance

Senator George Maziarz is pleased to learn the City of North Tonawanda has been awarded a grant in the amount of \$343,000 from the New York State Office of Community Renewal to make improvements at the Carnegie Art Center. The 2012 CFA round included funding in the form of the Community Renewal Fund (CRF). The improvements will include having handicap accessible access to the city building, and handicap bathroom facilities.

"This funding will allow this historic building to undergo much needed renovations that will help it to better serve the public, especially those who are handicapped. These renovations will help move the Carnegie towards becoming a true events center. The goal is for this building to become yet another destination within North Tonawanda," stated Mayor Rob Ortt.
