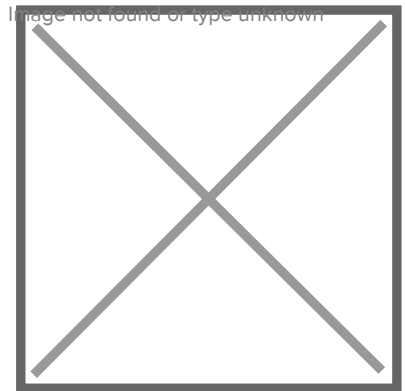
Senator Flanagan Announces New Counsel To Education Committee
