"From Susan B. Anthony to Elizabeth Cady Stanton to Harriet Tubman, these women played an important role in women's history.

The "Historic Women of Distinction Exhibit," celebrates the central role that women from New York played in changing the course of history, starting in 1848 when the first Women's Rights convention was held in Seneca Falls, to the present day. The exhibit includes women like Susan B. Anthony and Elizabeth Cady Stanton, two individuals who led the effort to give women the right to vote, as well as Harriet Tubman, best known for her role in the abolitionist movement.

"March is recognized as Women's History Month in New York State and it is important that we pay tribute to the remarkable women who have helped shape our history. This exhibit is an outstanding tribute to women, past and present, who are guiding our State to a brighter future," concluded Senator
