## Senator Flanagan Joins Letter Carriers To Help Stamp Out Hunger

The program is designed to help local families who rely on this assistance throughout the summer and is part of what is now the largest one-day food collection in the nation. According to the NALC, last year's effort produced more than 74 million pounds of food nationwide.

In an effort to make it more convenient for residents to participate in this effort, Senator Flanagan will be collecting donations at his office in Smithtown every weekday from now until Friday, May 9<sup>th</sup>. Anyone wishing to donate to the food drive can visit his office at 260 Middle Country Road in Smithtown during normal business hours.

According to the NALC, the list of items that will be collected during the event include non-perishable items such as canned meat and fish, soup, bottled juice, pasta, vegetables, cereal and rice. The organization asks residents to avoid donating any items that have expired or those in glass containers.

For residents who would like to make their donation from their home, items will be collected during normal mail routes on Saturday, May 10<sup>th</sup>. All donations should be placed by the mailbox or the front door to allow for easy pickup.
