

Senator Martins Views New Educational Technology at Shelter Rock Library

The library used the state funding to purchase new iPads for the children's department.

The iPads are preloaded with educational apps which teach children about subjects such as math, science, reading, writing, and problem solving in a fun way.

The funding will also enable the library to purchase additional e-readers and e-books for patrons to use, along with a mobile app to make it easier for residents to access library services. New iPads and laptops will also be purchased for use with the Library's Teen Tech Tutoring Program this fall.
