Beef Day is also one of my favorite fair days. I'll be judging a grilling contest among local media personalities as they vie for the title of "Branding Iron Chef." The amateurs then make way for the grill masters, as they try to create the "perfect" burger - an attempt my tastebuds wholeheartedly support.
