\$5.00 V.I.P. Sponsors passes are available that will admit one adult and up to five children at the V.I.P. entrances. Passes can be purchased in advanced at Circles located at 6901-3rd Avenue and the Bay Ridge Mail Station at 9728-3rd Avenue. A suggested donation of \$1 at the Haunted Walk and Fairytale Forest will help to support the event. Food and beverages will be sold at the event.
