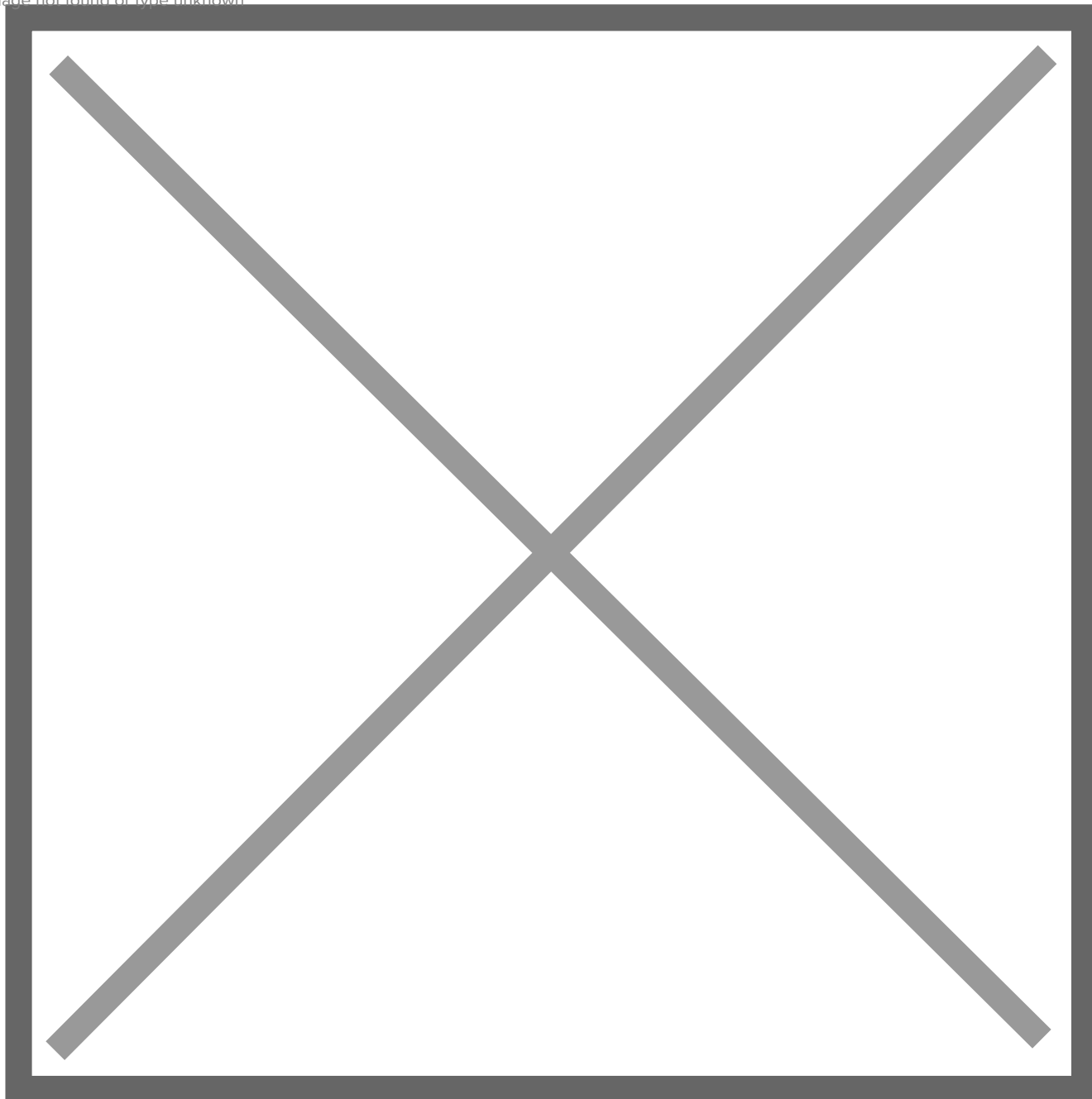

As a member of the State Senate Select Committee on Libraries, Senator Ritchie been working to make sure libraries can continue to provide educational opportunities, family-friendly entertainment, job-searching tools, books and technology.

Since 2011, Senator Ritchie and her colleagues have led the fight to support public libraries and have been successful in including \$15 million in restorations and increased budget funding for libraries across the state. In addition, to date, Senator Ritchie has secured more than \$250,000 in special funding to help enhance services at libraries across our region. As a result of this support, more than 50 libraries and two library networks have received the aid they need keep up with demand and improve their offerings and programs for patrons.
