ISSUE: CRIME, GUN CONTROL



During the Stop the Violence event hosted by SNUG on February 19, 2011, many were present to show support for the group's effort. New York State Senator Shirley L. SNUG members also help to build relationships between police and homeowners, business owners and residents of the community in order to create better communication and understanding to prevent future incidents. While SNUG does not replace law enforcement agencies, they have been known to help bridge the gap and build trust between communities and their local precincts. SNUG has been successful in its efforts to replace hostility with acceptance and tolerance.

Senator Huntley also proudly supports SNUG and their Don't Shoot N.Y. rally that will take place on February 27, 2011 at United Nations Plaza at 42nd Street and First Avenue. The event will begin at 2:30 P.M. and Senator Huntley enthusiastically encourages everyone to attend and join forces to end gun violence.
